

This is a survey about sensation below the neurological level of injury. The link has gone up on an Australian site, an English site and a Canadian site and I am very interested in getting an Irish input.

Phantom Sensations? (Psychosocial experiences and sensations in people with SCI)

Sensations (painful or otherwise) below the level of injury in people with a spinal cord injury are puzzling. I have already asked what people with an SCI think and feel about the sensations they experience and published this information in the journal "Disability and Rehabilitation." Now I'd like to find out about when the sensations are experienced and what a person is doing when they notice of them.

When you complete the survey you'll have the option to leave your first name and email/phone No. and I will enter you into a draw for €200. If you are not comfortable with leaving any identifying information and not participating; that's fine. You can withdraw from the survey at any time without giving any reason for doing so.

I'm a clinical psychophysiological and a mature PhD student based in Trinity College Dublin. I worked for 15 years in a rehabilitation hospital in California. Most of the participants I spoke with for the first study were from the US but, this time, I would like to get more opinions from people around the world.

The survey helps break the previous day down into chunks or sections and helps you remember very accurately. Then we ask you questions about those chunks of memory so depending how you break your day down the questionnaire will be longer or shorter.

If you have noticed painful or non-painful sensations below your neurological level of injury, give it a try. I'm looking at daily patterns and if there are any connections between the sensations and activities of daily living.
